The Common Crow visits gardens, particularly those with oleander bushes, but not generally in great numbers. On hot days it seems to like cool shady places, under trees or rock overhangs. The caterpillars eat the leaves of the Oleander, a plant that is poisonous to us, and the poisons in the plant pass on to the butterfly and protect it from predators.
